The Chair of the Board and Executive Director are very pleased to present the 2023 Abbey Retreat Centre Annual Report.

MISSION

Our mission continues to be the creation and strengthening of a safe, loving and healing community supporting those affected by cancer. Our retreats and online programs are based on research and best practices fueled by our compassionate, skilled, and highly trained program facilitators. **Our programs are unique across Canada** not only because of the inclusion of caregivers, but also because we provide our retreats at no cost to participants.

Through our work we are able to provide a sense of belonging, understanding, and compassion that is fundamental to a healing experience and helps to address some critical gaps in the continuum of cancer care in our currently overburdened healthcare system.

Those who are part of Abbey Retreat Centre report that one of our most beneficial impacts is the attention paid to the creation of an enduring and caring community amongst participants, volunteers, facilitators, employees, and Board Members alike.

CELEBRATING OUR VOLUNTEERS

We have an extraordinary group of committed and passionate volunteers who are critical to such a small and growing non-profit organization. With more than 100 volunteers in 2023, we were able to make all parts of our programming truly amazing. The "Warm Hug from the Highlands" program that provides cozy quilts for permanent and seasonal residents living with cancer continues to grow with the many dedicated quilting volunteers. Our Haliburton Highlands Challenge (HHC) fundraisers (over 60 people) helped us to raise awareness and critically important funds in 2023! Our volunteer bedmakers, grass cutters, retreat support chefs, community ambassadors and committee members contribute gifts, vision and time in ways that make us a vibrant and healthy organization. We are immensely grateful.

SIGNIFICANT ACHIEVEMENTS IN 2023

The Impact Report demonstrates the robust efforts and achievements of the last year. We introduced over 200 individuals and families to Abbey Retreat Centre's transformative cancer support initiatives. We began developing a fulsome facilitator training program, and recruited and trained 12 new facilitators to help grow and enhance our programming capacity. We received grants to renovate and add new program spaces to the facility. Grants also made it possible for us to continue offering our online programming, design and pilot an end-of-life retreat, support the presence of caregivers in our 4-day retreats and much more. Our Haliburton Highlands Challenge (HHC) raised \$96,000 to support our cancer wellness retreats and the generosity of many others helped us to ensure that no one walks alone through a cancer experience.

We enter our 2024 with over 200 people on our waitlist. We are motivated to work toward financial sustainability so that we can create safe and healing spaces for even more people.

EVOLUTION OF THE BOARD AND THE ORGANIZATION

2023 brought exciting growth and transformation to our organization. In the fall we embarked on a **Strategic Planning Process that provided a multi-year strategic plan to carry the organization successfully into 2026.** Building on our solid organizational foundation, we anticipate being able to expand our capacity on all fronts. With an extraordinary Executive Director and small but mighty staff, Abbey Retreat is ready to move confidently into the future.

With three new board members and an informed sense of direction, Abbey Retreat is poised to have an even greater impact serving more people living with cancer in the next two years.

Amongst the significant changes ahead, Abbey Retreat Centre is changing our name to better reflect our mission, vision, and values and highlight our evolution as an organization.

Thank you to our extraordinary community and everyone who contributes so much to Abbey Retreat Centre.






KELLY'S WORDS

A WARM THANK YOU

In the fall of 2022, I was invited to be part of a Practices for Creating Meaning 3-Day retreat. The timing was unbelievably perfect as my cancers had both progressed and I was feeling emotionally and physically too overwhelmed to fully grasp the optimism that had assisted me in navigating the cancer journey to that point.

I couldn't have anticipated how incredibly valuable each piece of the entire experience was going to be in helping me find the things I had much need for at that moment in time – exploration, communications, and connection with the spectrum of my genuine emotions – safe ways of expressing them and sharing amongst others also experiencing similar feelings.

Everything was amazing – the beautiful surroundings, the absolutely incredible food, the genuinely lovely people (other participants, staff, volunteers) and the skilled, talented facilitators who took us through the weekend's journey in an open, respectful, empathetic way. Their creative talents opened doors, inspired, and nurtured many painful, some frightening and all deeply impactful emotions – allowing us to examine, make some sense of and express (internally and/or externally – which ever we needed) much of what was in our heads and hearts but we had not been able to process or did not feel we should/could share with our loved ones. Wrapped around all this was much shared laughter and joy.

I felt nourished (in all ways) by the time we all parted that weekend. An energy of optimism and peace had returned that I had been struggling to regain. I also made some lovely connections with amazing people whose strength and insights continue to resonate in my thoughts and heart.

The Abbey Retreat Centre is a truly valuable resource – the thoughtfulness that continues to go into its operation and development is what I think allows it, as it grows, to remain true to the vision of "providing a safe and loving community to those affected by cancer".
